# Business IV Capstone Course

**Welcome** to Business IV. This class will give you the confidence and skills to make responsible financial decision. I'm looking forward to observing and working with you as you take the first steps in building life-long wealth and use your knowledge to build a business skill-set that will support your future endeavors.

### **Course Description:**

In this course you will gain expert knowledge from world-renowned financial advisor, Dave Ramsey and his team of experts using Foundations in Personal Finance curriculum. Lessons will be interactive, hands-on, and students will leave with tools to be financially successful as you begin to build your financial wealth. Second semester the class will collaborate with the other capstone courses on campus to complete various projects incorporating real-world scenarios to bring concepts to market.

# **Requirement for all Business IV students:**

All Business IV students are required to do one of the following:

- Complete an internship with a business in the community (60 hours minimum time) to earn credit on your high school transcript that will read "Business Internship" OR (30 hours minimum AND the capstone project)
- 2. Complete a capstone project where you will put to use all the skills you've learned in business over the course of the Business Pathway at SRA.

#### Due no later than May 1, 2020.

The <u>capstone project</u> can be tailored to your career goals; however, reading and completing a project on *Great By Choice*, by Jim Collins is required. See Mrs. Jenkins for guidance.

## **Grading Policy:**

Your grade will come from a variety of assignments, including group work, public speaking, quizzes, presentations, tests, and participation. **All assignments are due at the beginning of class.** No exceptions! No name and date, no credit. In most cases if a student misses a group presentation day he/she will have to make up their portion, but with one grade lower penalty. Late work is accepted up one week passed its due date for up to 50% credit. After 5 school days late assignments will not be accepted on able to be made up

#### **Absences:**

If a student misses 1 day he/she has 1 day to make up the work without consequence.
