Job responsibilities

- Measuring how much toxic drugs and radiation is inside your victim whether that may be a plant, atmosphere, human body, or animal

- Experimenting with different types of drugs to see what drugs have different types of effects on multiple things

- Running a drug test to see what toxins or medicines were found in the body at their time of death

- Recording the information about their findings in each suspects system

- Tracing the toxins back to where it came from, for example if some has Cocaine in their system the toxicologist would try to locate where the cocaine originated from by depicting what types ingredients that were used

- Toxicologists are always called when the death occurred because of possible toxins or radiation

Education and Salary

- Bachelor's degree in natural science like, forensic science, chemistry, or biology

- A four year high school diploma
- Also a major in human medicine, pharmacology or veterinary medicine would also be accepted
- Some jobs in this field require a graduate degree
- There is a 27% job growth in this field of jobs from the year 2014-2024
- The average salary for this job is \$56,320 per year

Job Responsibilities

- Determine the cause of death
- File and complete the death certificate
- Performs autopsies and external examinations
- Order and complete all lab results
- While completing the autopsy each major organ is weighed and logged on a formal document
- A Y incision is cut from the left shoulder to the right shoulder all the way down to the pubic bone
- The medical examiner doesn't just exam the inside of the body but they also run tests on the blood to see if any toxins were found in the blood if they are present then a toxicologist joins in on the case

Education and Salary

- High school diploma
- Four years of college and a bachelor's degree in medicine science or forensic science
- Need to earn an MD in medical schooling
- Additional four years of pathology to ensure that you understand the procedure of autopsies
- Some jobs require experience in the medical field before you can become a medical examiner
- The average salary is from \$91,324 to over \$187,000

- Sets up any electric tools that are sued during the autopsy

Education and Salary

- It is required to have a high school diploma
- At least one year work experience in a similar field is required including internships, and there school related opportunities
- Some jobs require an associates degree in mortuary science
- This job has a 27% job growth in the nest 10 years
- Has a yearly average salary of around \$35,298
